Visitors have seen the return of Sensory Friendly Days to TCM! We are excited to bring back this successful program with many improvements. Held quarterly, this events allow our visitors to experience the museum without all of the loud noises or large crowds. We are very thankful to our sponsors: Surfers for Autism. Summer has come and past and all of us here at the Museum had a great summer. We had over 100 different kids attend this year's summer camp with weekly themes like Drones, Harry Potter, & Space. Kids had a great time visiting places like the airport and have hands on encounters with live animals. We also hosted 2,670 feet through our doors with numerous field trip groups. We introduced our new free range format which all groups enjoyed. TCM staff have been very busy this summer with outreach programs. We visited 12 different schools and camps this year. 880 students learned about gardening, responsible money habits, African culture, and the rainforest. The TCM staff love being apart of the children's memories through camps, field trips and outreaches!

August has been an exciting time for the Museum. In honor of our 10th Birthday we have refurbished and added several exhibits. With a generous sponsorship from the Bauman Family Foundation we were able to upgrade the flooring and add new structures to Toddler Beach. We have added 2 brand new exhibits! Another major surprise came in July 2018 when the Children's Museum was notified by Mr. Peter Avonda that the late Mrs. Jewel Marvin and her husband was gifting stock valued at almost \$100,000! According to her obituary, Jewel Spencer Doering Marvin, passed away on December 25, 2017. She lived in Vero Beach, Florida and was formerly of Port St. Lucie and North Palm Beach.

Jewel was a Virginian by birth, the daughter of the late James William Spencer and Ethel Mason Spencer. She was a graduate of Averett College and The University of Mary Washington, after which she was affiliated with the F. B. I. until her marriage to golf professional



Arthur Doering, who passed away in 1988. In 1992, Jewel was married to Edward Stuart Marvin, retired employee of The Ford Motor Company in Dearborn. The Children's Museum is honored to be a recipient of this generous gift!
